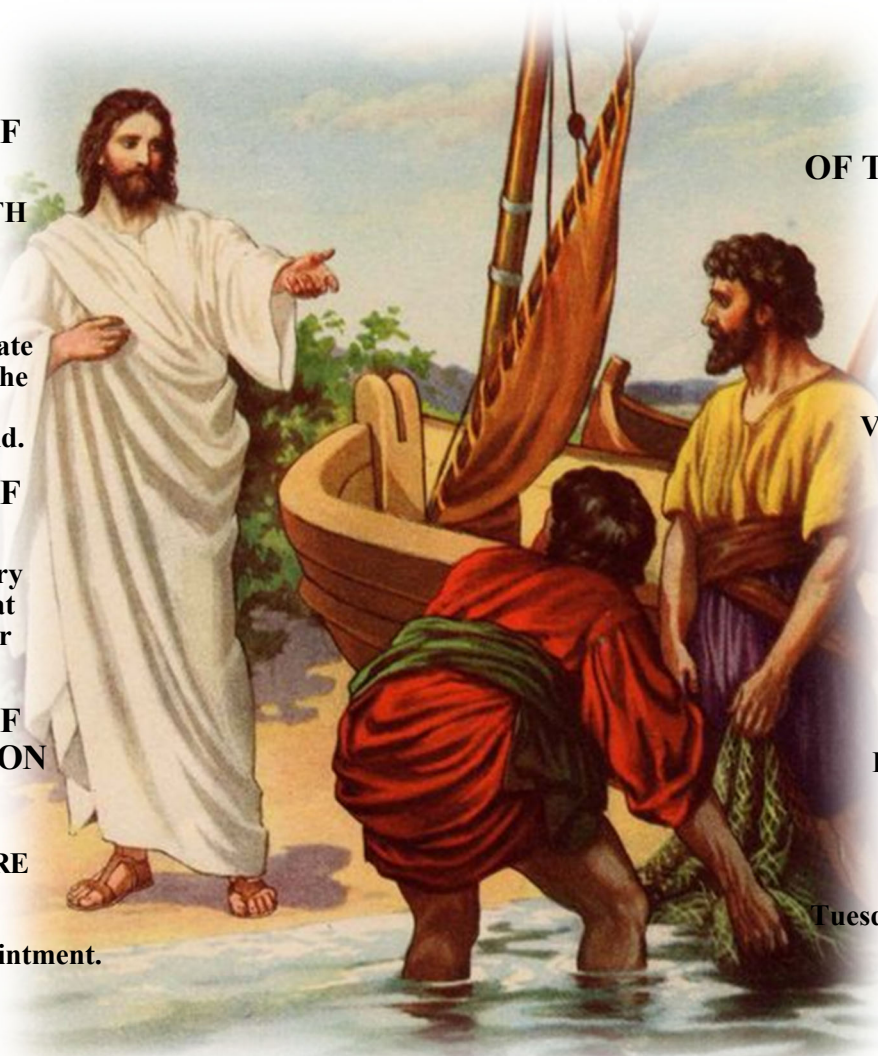

DO SOMETHING BEAUTIFUL FOR GOD

The Essential Teachings of Mother Teresa

Sunday, January 24: “Being unwanted, unloved, uncared for, forgotten by everybody, I think that is a much greater hunger, a much greater poverty than the person who has nothing to eat.”

Monday, January 25: “Your true character is most accurately measured by how you treat those who can do nothing for you.”

Tuesday, January 26: “I want you to be concerned about your next-door neighbor. Do you know your next-door neighbor?”

Wednesday, January 27: “We think sometimes that poverty is only being hungry, naked and homeless. The poverty of being unwanted, unloved and uncared for is the greatest poverty. We must start in our own homes to remedy this kind of poverty.”

Thursday, January 28: “When we have nothing to give, let us give Him that nothingness. Let us all remain as empty as possible, so that God can fill us.”

Friday, January 29: “The more you have, the more you are occupied, the less you give. But the less you have the more free you are. Poverty for us is a freedom. It is not mortification or penance. It is joyful freedom. There is no television here, no this, no that. But we are perfectly happy.”

Saturday, January 30: “Love begins at home, and it is not how much we do...but how much love we put in that action.”

THE FARMER'S PRAYER

A while back I read a story of a visiting pastor who attended a men's breakfast in the middle of a rural farming area of the country. The group had asked an older farmer, decked out in bib overalls, to say grace for the morning breakfast.

"Lord, I hate buttermilk," the farmer began. The visiting pastor opened one eye to glance at the farmer and wonder where this was going.

The farmer loudly proclaimed, "Lord, I hate lard." Now the pastor was growing concerned.

Without missing a beat, the farmer continued, "And Lord, you know I don't much care for raw white flour."

The pastor once again opened an eye to glance around the room and saw that he wasn't the only one beginning to feel uncomfortable.

Then the farmer added, "But Lord, when you mix them all together and bake them, I do love warm fresh biscuits."

"So, Lord, when things come up that we don't like, when life gets hard, when we don't understand what you're saying to us, help us to just relax and wait until you are done mixing. It will probably be even better than biscuits."
