# ALL SAINTS DAY

(November 1)

All Saints' Day, also known as All Hallows' Day, Halloween, the Feast of All Saints, or Solemnity of All Saints, is a Christian solemnity celebrated in honor of all the saints, known and unknown. In Western Christianity, it is celebrated on November 1 by the Roman Catholic Church, the Anglican Communion, the Methodist Church, the Philippine Independent Church (Iglesia Filipina Independiente), the Church of the Nazarene, the Lutheran Church, the Reformed Church, and other Protestant churches. November 1 is also the day before All Souls' Day.

The Christian celebration of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day stems from a belief that there is a powerful spiritual bond between those in heaven (the "Church triumphant"), and the living (the "Church militant"). In Catholic theology, the day commemorates all those who have attained the beatific vision in Heaven. In Methodist theology, All Saints Day revolves around "giving God solemn thanks for the lives and deaths of his saints", including those who are "famous or obscure". As such, individuals throughout the Church Universal are honored, such as Paul the Apostle, Augustine of Hippo and John Wesley, in addition to individuals who have personally led one to faith in Jesus, such as one's grandmother or friend.



## Meditation of the Day

Holy Mother Church, always solicitous and anxious for our salvation, exults today with exceeding joy as she contemplates the glory of her children who, having reached their heavenly fatherland, are safe for all eternity, forever delivered from the snares of the evil one, and now numbered everlastingly among the elect, the people of God. Like a mother, proud of the triumph of her children, she presents them to the whole Christian world, inviting all the faithful to share her maternal joy: "Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating a feast in honor of all the Saints, at whose solemnity the Angels rejoice and give praise to the Son of God."... Ranks of martyrs, apostles, confessors, and virgins, luminous hosts who delight unceasingly in the vision of God, adore Him continually and praise him as they repeat: *Benediction and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and strength to our God forever and ever Amen.*

Who are these glorious Saints? People who have lived upon earth as we have, who have known our miseries, our difficulties, our struggles. Some of them we recognize easily, for the church has raised them to the honors of the Altar, but the great majority are entirely unknown to us. They are humble people who lived obscurely in the accomplishment of duty, without display, without renown, whom no one here below remembers, but whom the heavenly Father looked upon, new in secret, and, having proved their fidelity, called to His glory. The honorable positions occupied by some in this vast gathering, or the mighty deeds accomplished by others, no longer possess any value of themselves: eternal beatitude is not determined by the great things achieved here below. One thing only endures, for the humble and the great, the poor and the wealthy: the degree of love they had attained, to which corresponds the degree of glory which now renders them eternally happy.

# All Souls, Purgatory and Indulgences

(The Carmelite Nuns of Brooklyn)

“I was in Purgatory tonight. It was as if I were being led into an abyss, where I saw a large hole. It is touching to see the Poor Souls so quiet and sad. Yet their faces revealed that they have joy in their hearts, because of their recollection of God's loving mercy. On a glorious throne, I saw the Blessed Virgin, more beautiful than I had ever beheld Her. She said, “I entreat you to instruct people to pray for the suffering Souls in Purgatory, for they certainly will pray much for us out of gratitude. Prayer for these Holy Souls is very pleasing to God because it enables them to see Him sooner...” (Bd. Anne Catherine Emmerich.) During the month of November, which is quickly approaching, let us redouble our efforts to assist the souls in Purgatory, especially by praying for them and above all, having the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered on their behalf. The greatest charity we can offer to our loved ones, who have departed from this life, is prayer on their behalf, especially the most efficacious prayer, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Many indulgences may be gained for the Holy Souls.

Our Holy Mother Church offers us the opportunity to gain plenary indulgences applicable to the Holy Souls, which remits all of the temporal punishment due to sin, on November 2nd, by visiting a Church or Cemetery, and reciting the Creed, Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be, along with the other usual conditions: the reception of Holy Communion, confession within a week, reciting an Our Father and Hail Mary for the Pope's intentions, are remaining free from attachment to sin. From November 1st - 8th of November, a plenary indulgence may be gained *each day* by visiting a cemetery, and fulfilling the usual conditions listed above. In addition, countless partial indulgences can be gained for the Holy Souls which brings them tremendous relief, by making the Stations of the Cross, praying the Rosary, offering a Holy Hour, making aspirations on their behalf throughout the day, etc. When the Stations of the Cross are made or a Rosary prayed, followed by prayers for the Holy Father's intentions and following the usual conditions, a plenary indulgence may be gained even daily.

Those in the state of purgation or cleansing cannot help themselves, but we can help them attain Heaven more quickly by praying for them, offering our sufferings, works and good actions. The power of love within the Mystical Body, the Church, goes on after death. We can help others, even as we hope to be helped. By praying for the Holy Souls, we ourselves benefit as well, because the Holy Souls are powerful intercessors. When they are released on account of the prayers and Masses which we have offered for them, their gratitude is boundless.

## Prayer for the Holy Souls

My Jesus, by the sorrows You suffered in Your agony in the Garden, in Your scourging and crowning with thorns, on the way to Calvary, in Your crucifixion and death, have mercy on the souls in Purgatory and especially on those who are most forsaken. Delivered them from the torments they endure. Call them and admit them to Your most sweet embrace in Paradise. Amen. (Pray one Our Father, three Hail Mary's, one Glory Be..)

## Novena Prayer

Mother of Mercy, I believe in the promises of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in the immortality of the soul, in eternal life and the Resurrection of the dead. I think today of my departed loved ones (names...) and place them under your protection. Enfold them now with your peace. Lead them out of the valley of the shadow of death into the joyful companionship of the Most Blessed Trinity, with you dear mother, and all the Angels and Saints. I pray for all the souls in Purgatory, especially those who are most forgotten. May our Lord Jesus Christ wipe away every tear from their eyes and fill them with unending happiness. Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithfully departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.

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
